#### NUT-FREE SCHOOL

At Saint Anne's we strive to provide a safe learning environment for all students and due to some of our pupils and staff suffering with life threatening nut allergies, we would like to remind our parents we are a **NUT-FREE SCHOOL.** 

An allergic reaction (anaphylactic shock) can occur through ingestion of nut products, cross contamination and breathing nut dust in the air. Since this condition can be life threatening, we are asking all members of the school community for their help in minimising the risk to these children by:

- a) Avoiding giving children nuts or nut products in their packed lunches
- b) Avoiding giving nuts or nut products or snacks/bars containing nuts for break time snacks
- Avoiding supplying the school with cakes or food items containing nuts for birthday celebrations, sales or events

We do acknowledge that many foods are labelled as 'may have been produced in a factory handling nuts and cannot be guaranteed to be nut free'. Such items will be allowed in school as it would be unreasonable to expect these to be kept out of school.

Please note where a member of staff notices a pupil eating a nut product, the product will be removed politely and the member of staff will explain why this has to be done. A message will then be sent to the parent to explain what has happened so they are fully informed and to remind them of the Nut-free policy.

Due to the severity of the problem, it is important that all parents carry out the suggested measures and reduce the risk of allergic reaction to these children. I realise this is a significant change in school policy but it has been introduced due to specific allergies of some pupils so that the school takes all reasonable steps to keep all of its pupils safe.

### Apply now for free school meals.

If you think you maybe eligible for free school meals please make an application following the link below.

#### Apply for free school meals - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Children in Reception class through to Year 2 all receive Government funded Universal free school meals. To receive free school meal vouchers through the holidays you must have made an application to see if you are eligible.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

Income Support

income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

income-related Employment and Support Allowance

support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

the guaranteed element of Pension Credit

- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

Your child may also get free school meals if you get any of these benefits and your child is both:

younger than the compulsory age for starting school in full-time education

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#### Infant free school meals in England

Your child will be able to get free school meals if they're in a <u>government-funded school</u> and in:

reception class year 1 year 2

Tell your local authority if you also get any of the qualifying benefits. Your child's school can get extra funding if you do.

Dear families

We have received information from the Local Authority regarding the bus services that currently operate to service the school. The official correspondence is below:

Coventry City Council has started its process of setting the budget for 2024/25 but faces difficult choices ahead with a £12m funding shortfall this financial year, which is set to rise to around £30m next year. A report is set to go to Cabinet on 12 December for permission to start consultation on potential savings. The consultation will run until 7<sup>th</sup> February 2024 before elected members agree the final Budget at the end of that month.

As part of these proposals the Council is proposing to remove funding subsidising the following school bus routes:

- The Number 50 Bus
- The Number 60 Bus (expanded capacity to be removed)
- The Number 48 Bus
- The Number 40 Bus
- The Number 49 Bus

If the proposal is agreed then these services will not continue after July 24. You can access more information and respond to the budget consultation at https://letstalk.coventry.gov.uk/ from 13 December.

Coventry City Council will continue to provide bus passes for children entitled to statutory support for home to school transport to enable them to utilise the public transport network in line with the following policy and guidance: <a href="https://www.coventry.gov.uk/schools-schooling/school-travel-passes/2">https://www.coventry.gov.uk/schools-schooling/school-travel-passes/2</a>

This news means that from September 2024 Bishop Ullathorne Catholic School will no longer have any dedicated bus travel. All public transport to and from school will need to be on public bus routes. I recognise that this will have a significant impact on families planning safe travel to and from school for their children. I would therefore strongly recommend parents respond to the consultation to ensure our school position is heard. The removal of these bus routes will place over 300 extra students into an already stretched and unreliable public transport system.
