## Afterschool Kid Club

Letters were sent home to all of our parents on Wednesday to explain the new costings for the Kids Club. The charge now will be $£ 5$ per session. This is in line with other schools and child care facilities and it reflects the need to have more staff on site to accommodate our growing number of parents. Please ensure you make your bookings via the online form that was emailed out as soon as possible. The sessions do book up quickly. The kids club is there for our working parents to assist with aftercare provision. We will also be introducing a late fee if parents are late in collecting their children.

## Covid

Can we remind parents of our one way system and to still wear masks whilst on school grounds. Numbers are increasing again and we really do not want yet another lockdown. We are still having lots of children coming through the Reception area as they are late. Gates shut promptly at 8.55 am . Can we also remind you to get your children to take regular lateral flow tests. All of our staff are doing this, and it is one tool we have to quickly identify cases and prevent spread. There have been a number of schools in the city that have had to shut completely due to outbreaks amongst children and staff. You are probably frustrated about the conflicting messages and details around being covid safe at the moment. We can assure you that the decisions we make are based on advice we get from the local authority. We understand it seems nonsensical that 60000 people can attend Wembley but you can't attend sports day in school, but we have to keep following the rules to limit the chances of the last few weeks of school being disrupted.

## New Classes for next year

I cannot apologise enough for still not being in a position to tell you, or the children, who their class teacher will be next year. I am awaiting on one more member to confirm availability and work pattern for next year, but I will definitely be able to tell you on Monday. Again, I apologise for this. It is not something I have ever left so late before, but I would rather leave it late than tell you one thing and then have to change it at a later date.

## Lunch Time Supervisor

You should have received a text informing you that we are looking to appoint a lunchtime supervisor. The details for this job can be found on WM jobs. It is for 6 and three quarter hours per week. This means that if you are in receipt of benefits, it does not affect them at all but would provide with extra money for the month. If you are interested, and would like an informal chat about the role, you can phone up and speak to Mrs Grenfell or one of our family support workers. It is always lovely when we get interest from our parents, so we hope this is a position that $w$ can fill from our existing parents in school.

## Netball

Please can we remind you that netball practice has now finished for the year. We look forward to starting with new children in the new year.

## Reports

Your child's class reports are being finalised as we speak. They should be ready to go home next Friday. You will notice that this year we have been instructed by the DFE not to report on attendance. Understandably, this is because of the many disruptions that have taken place through no fault of the children. As always, you are invited to make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher (phone conversation) if you would like to raise anything in it. We do urge you to take up this opportunity. We have had precious few opportunities to celebrate the children in a way that directly involves you this year-this could correct that. The details will be on the letter that goes home with the report. We look forward to having a high uptake of responses.

## Last day of term

Reminder that the last day for the children in school will be Tuesday 20th July. The very last day will be sports day and a barbeque and ice cream parlour for the whole school. We hope it will be a lovely way to end off what has been a very difficult

Starting from Monday September 6th 2021 the Kids Club after school care will increase its price to 55.00 per session, per child. ## WhatsApp: group chats



> You must be at least 16 years old to register for and use WhatsApp. WhatsApp is a free messaging app that allows you to send messages and videos.

Group chats
One of the main features is that it has a Group chat function that are set up by one person (who is the admin). Everybody in the group, even if they're not one of your child's phone contacts, will be able to see all messages within that group. If your child is added to a group with someone that they have previously blocked, that person can still see their messages and send them messages within the group. You can leave a group chat at any point so talk to your child and encourage them to leave any chat that makes them feel uncomfortable.

## Change Group Privacy settings

In settings, you can change who can add your child to groups, for example, you can change the settings to 'my contacts', which means that only those in your child's contacts can add them to a group.

## Online Bullying

WhatsApp has been used in instances of online bullying, for example sending nasty messages or sharing images of other children without their permission to embarrass them. It's important to have regular chats with your child about their online life and that they understand that they must talk to you or another trusted adult if they are being bullied. ## Discord

## What is Discord?

Discord is a social networking app that is used by gamers to chat to each other. There can be in app purchases through Discord's premium subscription service. The minimum age to access Discord is 13.

## How does it work?

Discord is made up of servers, which are spaces for groups of friends to chat, upload files and share images etc. Anybody can set up a server and they can either be public or private. Users can video call and send direct messages to other individuals or to groups of up to 9 people. By default, all direct messages are scanned and explicit content is blocked.

## How can I make it safer?

## How is it linked to other games?

Children who play online games such as Fortnite may use Discord to chat about the game (rather than the game's own chat facility).

## What do I need to be aware of?

We always encourage you to chat to your child to see why they use different apps/websites and ensure that they know how to block users and what to do if they see any inappropriate content. It's important to be aware that Discord does include video/voice calling which cannot be filtered.
