## **Newsletter: Friday 1st April 2022**

#### LIVING WITH COVID

As you will be aware, the government has now entered its final stage of the COVID roadmap. We are now all learning to live with covid'. Free testing has now been stopped (except for the most vulnerable) Restrictions have been eased in terms of self isolation. If you think your child has covid, but you Symptomatic and asymptomatic testing (PCR and LFT) will cease for the majority of the population, with the exception of a number of settings identified in the press release.

People with respiratory symptoms (including COVID-19 symptoms) should stay at home, avoid contact with others and return to normal activities when well enough and don't have a temperature. For schools and early years settings this means that children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

For adults testing positive for COVID-19 (some people will still have LFT kits available), they should stay at home for 5 days and avoid contact with others. They should then return to normal activities, only if well enough and don't have a temperature.

For children testing positive for COVID -19 (under 18 years old), they should stay at home for 3 days and avoid contact with others. They should then return to school and normal activities only if well enough and don't have a temperature.

#### **TERMLY MERIT ASSEMBLY**

We are so excited that school is now Monday 4th April Children in returning to some sense of normality. The first step is to invite parents in to attend the termly merit assembly. The parents of children chosen as stars of the term have received invites. We really hope you can attend, if you have been notified. Please respond to the invitation to confirm your attendance. That way, we will be able to ensure everybody has a chair to sit on.

As we enter the third and final term of the year, our children in years 3-5 will start their swimming lessons. We are so fortunate to have the Alan Higgs centre so close to school. 




























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
