ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

It goes without saying that regular attendance at school is vital for every child to achieve to the very best of their ability. It is also a vital life skill—we know, as adults, that we will not hold down a job if constantly late to work. It is now that we need to teach children the importance of having a good routine and arriving to school on time. Every minute lost has an impact. Children do not like walking late into a classroom. It disturbs the teacher and it disturbs the other children whose lessons will have already started. You can see the quite alarming statistics in the table below. Being late for 5 minutes every day equates to 3 days lost in a year. 15 minutes late every day equates to 10 days lost. Please teach your child excellent habits in terms of their attendance and punctuation. If you are regularly 5,10,15 minutes late, please just adjust your alarm so the children do not miss out on any aspect of school life. Thank you


