### HOME TIME

The reason Mrs Gough and I still stagger entry into school at the end of the day is because, if we don't, there is a bottleneck on the school playground. The children are so sensible in walking to greet you as you reach them. If there are too many parents, they cannot see you as clearly and what has become a very efficient system breaks down. Sometimes we are not greeted with understanding when we stop people entering, but we never keep people waiting for long and it actually is a lot quicker for you in the long run. We are not trying to annoy people, but after using this system for over two years now, we believe it is the quickest, safest and easiest way for you all to collect your children and to get home as quickly as possible. May I remind you again that no scooters or bikes should be ridden on site ANYWHERE, including on the pavement by the car park. WE request you leave any wheeled toys with us by the gate and collect when you exit. In doing this, everyone will be kept safe and no staff will be lumbered with an expensive repair job from a bike/scooter crashing into their car. Thank you for your co-operation.

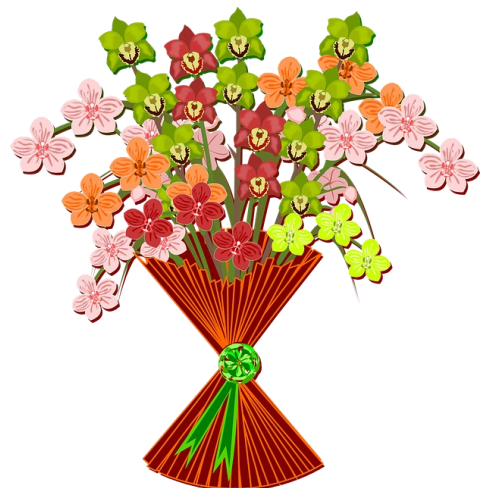
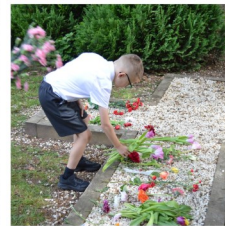
